

Feature Vehicle

1968 Holden base model coupe.

Designated identity as Model 80337.

The Vehicle was pressed and assembled at Holden's Dandenong Plant.

It was made around March/April 1968, so it was probably a car made for stock, before the release of the Monaro in July 1968.

It spent some time on the New Car lot and finally hit the road on the 12th of December 1968, through the Dandenong Holden dealer, we think was Market Motors, at a new car price of \$2,575. This price was increased due to the options of 307V8, Power glide Transmission, Limited Slip Differential of 2.78:1 ratio, Tinted/Laminated Windshield, Deluxe Heater/Demister, Power Disk Brakes, Floor Shift Console, Special Instrument Cluster, Tachometer, Deluxe 11 Transistor Push Button Radio, Rear Seat Speaker

The additions made to the car during the restoration was an Interior Finish Package consisting of chrome scuff

plates, carpet and carpet on the bottom of the door trims. It has been fitted with a Quadrajet Carburettor, Twin exhaust system both of which

appear in the HK options list in 1968.

The car is painted in Ermine White Acrylic, with Goya Red Interior and the wheels are a 1968 cast "Hustler" from the Sampson Foundry in South Australia, the forerunner to ROH wheels.

Price of the rebuild is unobtainable, but Shannon's have valued the vehicle at about \$70,000.

FEDERATION REPORT -

The Federation is writing to the Government to ask for the abolition of tariffs on imported and luxury vehicles.

The luxury car tax is currently 33% on vehicles over \$60,316.

Other duties on imported vehicles are said to add \$1,000 to Ford Ranger, Ford Focus, Toyota Corolla, Mazda 2, Honda Civic, Jazz and CRV and an estimated \$1,300 on Toyota Hilux, Mitsubishi Triton, Holden Colorado and Nissan Navara.

Budget papers show that car tariffs, including luxury car tax and the excise and customs duty on passenger motor vehicles will raise \$1.12bn this financial year, rising to \$1.28bn in 2020-21.

Tariffs and duties are quite complex, probably so that we run out of interest in trying to understand them, Governments are not in the practice of removing tax. We will wait and see.











