

MOTOR SHOW OF SUPPORT



I found this photo a very powerful reminder of what devastation wild fire can create when it comes close to home. Like everything in life, certain factors have to come into play which adds to the severity of the issue. The fires of St. Patrick's Day was a reminder to me of time spent in the CFA during the Ash Wednesday Fires.

This led to the thought of a gathering of vehicle enthusiasts from across Victoria to help the people that have been effected by the fires, so then started the planning of Motor Show of Support.



The result was approximately 370 vehicles gathering on the Deakin University football oval covering almost 100 years of motoring from 1920s through to the present day. Every colour and shape was covered along with lots of story telling throughout the day. Collectively they all helped in raising the total of upwards of \$12,500.

This figure could not have been reached without a number of factors coming into play, like the fires that were made impossible to control in the early hours because of the wind, darkness and fuel. The weather was very kind to us, the enthusiasts turned up along with their vehicles and the public came in for a look.

The day could not have been possible without the help from a lot of people, still to this day, the cost to hold the event was \$0. That is because when people were asked to assist, they said yes without charge.



The number of youngsters that dragged their parents along was great to see, they will be the buyers of our pride and joys and hopefully they will have memories of the day that may be fulfilled one day with a purchase of a project.

The participation of our car club cannot be underestimated, weather it was via a donation, entry with a vehicle or voluntary help on the day, it all added to the success of the day. Some members helped behind the scenes and requested no mention, it was noted, your assistance was gratefully accepted.

The purpose of the day was to raise money for fire relief and I think we succeeded. The result will be put to use in the repair, all be it

part, across the three fires of that terrible day. The Bendigo Bank in partnership with the VFF will give direction as to where the money raised will be spent.

The Federation played a big part in spreading the word of the day through the sending out of the flyer before the day, through the delegates and various club members that form the Federation network. They had a collection tin out at

I hope that we have in some small way, help the people who have been hit head on with this disaster and they realize that they are not alone.

The 1955 Cadillac that Juan Peron never got to drive

We were recently on holiday in Argentina and had a stopover in Buenos Aires. On a self guided walking tour of the city courtesy of the Lonely Planet Guide we walked to the Casa Rosada (the Pink House). This pink coloured building dominates the Plaza de Mayo in the city centre being the seat of the Argentine national government and houses the

President's office. It has been the scene of much of the nation's history and it was from the balconies that President Juan and Eva ("Evita") Perón gave speeches during the late 1940s and early 1950s. Juan Peron was the President of Argentina from 1946 to September 1955 when he was deposed in a military coup and went into exile. He was returned to office in 1973 and died in 1974. If you don't recall that then maybe you've heard of his second wife who was the glamorous Eva Peron who died at age of 33 in 1952 and who became the subject of Andrew Lloyd Weber and Time Rice's musical "Evita" (Don't cry for me Argentina etc). If you don't remember that then don't worry I'll tell you about Juan's car...



Behind the Casa Rosada is the Casa Rosada Museum which primarily houses the remains of a 300 year old fort and has an interesting display of the turbulent history of Argentina. It also houses a 1955 Cadillac Model 62 2 door convertible ordered by Juan Peron in early 1955. The Perons owned a 1951 Cadillac (which recently sold in auction for about \$150,000) and Juan decided a new one would be a good idea. Unfortunately it was delivered after the military overthrew him on September 16 in 1955. As a result, he never got to drive it, although many of his successors did. In recent years the car had deteriorated but in 2016, the Museo del Automovil Foundation restored it and is now on display inside the Casa Rosada museum for all to see – including us on our visit to the museum.




The Cadillac Series 62 is a series of cars produced from 1940 through to 1964. They had either 331 or 365 cu in engines (not sure what this one had) and a 4 speed auto transmission. Peron's car was in the fourth generation of the Series 62 (1954-1956). The sixth generation from 1959 – 60 is remembered for being the model with the huge tail fins. Although for 1955 the fins were just starting it's still a great looking car and this one was a credit to those who restored it. While admiring the Cadillac I noticed two you men dressed in 1800s Argentinean soldier uniforms who were walking around the museum on some sort of living history display. So in my best Spanish I said: "Australiano! Por favor, una foto



by el Cadillac.". They looked at me rather perplexed (I wonder why!) but I finally convinced them to stand with me for a photo. So that's me above doing my tourist thing with these two perplexed young soldiers.

The other exhibits on four wheels of interest were three horse drawn carriages used in the late nineteenth century by various Argentinean Presidents. . All were well restored and presented.
