

# **Cuban Fire Crisis**

On our US tour we had been in Kansas, Nebraska and Iowa and then came south to pick up Route 66 close to a town called Cuba in Missouri which is about 600 km south west of Chicago. Our plan was to see some of the sights along that stretch of Route 66 and end up in Chicago which is the start/end of Route 66 (other end is at Santa Monica California). At Cuba there is a well-known Route 66 roadside attraction called Bob's Gasoline Alley. The owner, Bob Mullen, works in Cuba and his collection is only open upon request. We called ahead and he kindly agreed to open especially for us about 6 pm and he and his wife Darlene were there to meet us. It is an amazing place with some roadside relics parked outside and three building with his vast collection inside. Bob has been collecting for 14 years and has bowsers, signs, toys, mock up diners with mannequins etc, model cars, a statue of Elvis and all sorts of other stuff. So we stayed for an hour and also had a chat to him. As well as many people driving Route 66 he has an Australian tour organiser who comes by four times a year with tour groups (mainly Aussies) and he has an Australian flag on display inside the entrance. He has several dining areas inside and hosts functions etc. It was a great place to stop and Bob and Darlene were great hosts. The photos only show a small part of his collection.

## Carlisle and Hershey Swap Meets and Gas Pump Graveyard

We arrived in Pennsylvania on Tuesday October 2nd and had a quick visit to the site of the Battle of Gettysburg which is only 50 km south of Carlisle. The battle was fought from July 1–3, 1863 in and around the town of Gettysburg by Union and Confederate forces during the American Civil War. The battle resulted in about 50,000 casualties being the largest number of casualties of the entire war. The Union army defeated Robert E Lee's Confederate army which was attempting to invade the North. It was the turning point in favour of the North. Four months later President Lincoln used the dedication ceremony for the Gettysburg National Cemetery to honour fallen Union soldiers and redefine the purpose of the war for the emancipation of the slaves in his historic Gettysburg Address. There is an excellent National Park museum which sets the scene for the battle and describes the lead up to and progress of the battle. Then a 30 km drive around the battle site following both Confederate and Union lines and the actual town of Gettysburg. Many memorials and cemeteries show where key events occurred.

After that, more positive things, and we went to "set up day" at Carlisle in the afternoon. Carlisle is 25 Km west of the Pennsylvania Capital of Harrisburg. Both



Carlisle and Hersey swap meets we attended are what they call Fall swap meets and they also have similar Spring swaps in March. You can enter for free and buy stuff from vendors even though trading starts following day. We then had following two days at the swap. There are supposed to be about 8000 sites but it was possible to get around all sites in one day so I suspect there were only about 2000 and the other 6000 may have been the squirrels burying acorns for winter. All around the site local businesses and private home owners charge \$10 for a day's parking which made for a short walk back to van with any purchases and entry was \$12. Mainly 60s and 70s American parts and associated stuff including gas pumps, bikes, signs, toy cars and repro stuff but no household and rusty stuff like we see at Bendigo etc. The site is mainly paved and well laid out but I heard some stories that in the past before it was paved that when it rained the site became a quagmire.

After that we had 4 days and so went to New Jersey/New York which is only 3 hours drive away. Among other things we went to visit our friend Lenny in Brooklyn (see YouTube "Lenny's Garage") who we visited last year and this time saw his collection of "foreign cars", visited a man with two early Paige Detroit cars, visited the Thomas Edison Museum and had a paddle in the Atlantic Ocean at Jersey Shores. On the way back to Hershey (about 20 km east of Harrisburg) we stopped in for a prearranged visit to see "John" in a small town. He has had a business for the last 35 years of installing and servicing gas pumps. He had a large warehouse and also a graveyard outside with about 1000 dead pumps all lined up in neat rows. He had some rusty Erie, Tokhiem and Waynes



from 50s and 60s but most were more recent from 80s onwards. Had a great time looking at some of his more collectible pumps inside.

Then to Hershey. First morning (Tuesday) we went to the American Antique Car Club museum close by to view their excellent car collection (went there last year also). This year the feature vehicle was Ford Mustang with about 10 on display. About 80

vehicles in total on display from 1890s through to 1980s. Except for some survivor cars, most were superb restorations with period backdrops of service stations, diners and other historical photos, displays, etc.



Late that morning we went to the swap site for "set up day" which was free entry. Hershey site is huge with about 9000 vendor sites and this time I really believed it. The overall site is bisected by a highway with a pedestrian overpass and there are five colour coded areas; red, chocolate north, chocolate south, green and orange. With determination one could see two of those areas in a day. There is paved parking close by for \$30 and some on grass further away for \$10. Entry is free. We chose the former and it worked out well for drop off of purchases rather than carrying them around. We were then at the site for 3 days after set up day. The set up day and first day of official trading were best for good "stuff" and vendors willing to negotiate. Those days were sunny about 25-30 C. The next day was warm but it rained and at times it was a downpour. The last day was fine but cold. People who have been going there for forty years said that earlier years the site was rolling grassland and could become flooded and weather could be anything from sunny days to snowing. There is also a "car corral" with vehicles parked on a sealed roadway on the site. There must have been at least 500 vehicles parked on both sides of the road with a space through the middle to check out the cars. Many were for sale and some just on display. 1910s to 1990s cars. Quite an amazing outdoor museum and I only walked about a quarter of the length (tired legs!). Left very satisfied.




