


# Roger Warburton's "Shed" at Penshurst Schramm's Garage

## **Federation Report - July**

The AHMF (Australian Historic Motoring Federation Inc) will be holding the 2020 National Historic Motoring Festival next year between Saturday March 28th and Friday April 3rd.

Vehicles that are included in the Festival – Veteran, Vintage, Post Vintage, Historic 50's, Historic 60's, Historic 70's, Historic 80's etc up to 1995, Commercial Vehicles, Historic Motorcycles, Historic Caravans, Tractors and Traction Machinery.

This is the first national festival to be held since the Shannons 2001 Tour in Canberra, and it is hoped that one will be held every 5 years rotating the states.

Nationally the sums have been done as to the financial benefit of the movement and considering the running costs of our vehicles, restorations and events that we participate in. The AHMF represents over 100,000 members, If each member spent just \$1,000 per year, combined we would spend in excess of \$100 million.

The event is focusing on the 'Next Generation' and younger people driving older cars. The movement has battled with the slow introduction of younger members, the AHMF are subsidizing the children entered for the festival, not driving though.

Some statistics of entrants so far:

30% are Veteran and Vintage, 50% are pre-1960, 50% are 1965 to 1995, 85% have 2 or more entrants per vehicle, the youngest driver so far is 21 years old and driving a 1923 vehicle and the oldest driver so far is driving a 1948 vehicle.

The Bendigo Swap is under 4 months away and this is the major fundraiser for the Federation to complete what they do over the next twelve months. There will be a gate roster doing the rounds over the next two months, members are asked to spend an hour or two on the gates at the swap. The club receives a payment per hour per gate volunteer and the volunteer receives a free weekend entry to the swap. All round, everyone's a winner.

Next Federation Meeting is in Mildura, held by the Mildura Vintage Vehicle Club, on the 3rd of August, followed by the AGM.













