

Route 66 Car Museum - Springfield Missouri

Recently my son and I drove between Joplin and Springfield Missouri on a freeway which was close to old Route 66. In Springfield there is a car museum called "Route 66 Car Museum" so we decided it was worth a visit.



The museum is owned by Guy Mace who started collecting in 1990 when he bought his first Jaguar. The collection mow has 80 cars with a range of American

and European (mainly British) cars from a 1907 REO to a 2005 Morgan. Most were in the 1920-1950s. He has a number of British cars including seven Jaguars, two Rolls Royces and two Allards and two Morgans including a 1963 owned by Desert Storm's General Norman Schwarzkopf, a Sunbeam and a MGA, an Alvis and Austin Healey. Of the 80 cars I picked three representing American, German and British to highlight below.

The first is American being a 1954 Kaiser Darrin. This car is No 286 out of total production of 435 made in 1953/4. The car was built by Kaiser Motors and designed by Howard "Dutch" Darrin a famous car designer in the 1940s who held a patent for sliding doors. It was conceived as part of a push in Detroit to compete with European roadsters being imported to the US in the post–World War II period. The car has a fibreglass body built by a boat builder. It is powered y a 161 cu in (2.6 l) six cylinder F head engine designed by Willys and built by Continental that developed 90 hp. The cars proved to be underpowered and with production problems and financial problems they were only built for the 1954 model year. All the same it was a nice looking car with unique styling especially with the sliding doors.



The next is a German 1936 Horch 853, one of about 50 that were sold to the German government in 1937 for use by the military. This cabriolet is still in original condition. The fabric covered top has a lot of scratches and tears but the body and interior are in excellent shape. After the war was "appropriated" by the US and brought to the US. It spent time in museums and then was stored in South Dakota for 50 years. Gary Mace bought it at an auction in 2010.

The maker, August Horch had worked for Karl Benz in the early 1900s but set up his own company to build quality cars to compete with Mercedes-Benz. The Horch 853 was introduced in 1936 and 627 were produced until the start of World War II. Horch was one of the most important car companies in Germany before World War II but in 1932 merged with three other car manufacturers (Audi, DKW and Wanderer) and formed the Auto Union. The Horch Type 853 Sports Cabriolet was popular among Germany's rich and famous and the car of choice for German NAZI officers before and during the War. It has a 4.9 litre straight eight engine that delivered 120 HP and a top speed of j80 MPH.



The 3rd is a 1954 Jaguar XK 120 and the first in a line-up of five Jaguars (see below) also including a 1957 XK 140, a 1958 XK 150, 1969 XKE (second series E Type) and last in the line a 1974 XKE (also E Type). In 1948 Jaguar introduced the XK 120 and over 12,000 were made up to 1954. The 120 refers to its top speed of 120 mph which made It the world's fastest production car in 1948. XK 120s were very successful in racing and rallying, being powered by a 180 hp straight six engine. In 1954 Jaguar raced one in the first NASCAR road race at Linden airport, New Jersey. The car won and amazed both British and Americans. This cis a great car and the white wall tyres accentuate the paint.

Lakeland Motor Museum – Windemere UK

On the editor's recent trip to the UK and Europe a visit was made to the Lakeland Motor Museum on Lake Windemere in the Lakes District of the UK. This is close to Coniston Water where Donald Campbell (and his father before him) broke the water speed record in a series of boats called Bluebird. Donald was killed when he crashed his jet boat while attempting a return run for the world water speed record. The museum has a collection of original and movie reproductions of some of the bluebird series of boats and cars. The blue Bentley below was Campbell's private car and had a bluebird mascot on the radiator cap. The

museum had a quality display of English cars of many types and from different eras. The garagenalia was also of a first class standard and made your editor green with envy.....


























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
