Dear new Club Member,

The Club Committee and the members of the Warrnambool & District Historical Vehicle Club welcome you to our club. We appreciate your interest and thank you for your decision to become a member.

The Club is an Incorporated Association and hence it has a set of Rules (Constitution). You are welcome to read and familiarise yourself with the Rules and if you would like to see them please ask the Club Secretary.

The Rules contain a summary of the main objects of the Club which are:

- To encourage interest and appreciation of all categories of veteran, vintage and classic motor vehicles and motor cycles and also tractors, traction engines, steam machinery, stationary engines and any other vehicles considered to be of historical significance.
- To promote the restoration, exhibition and display of such vehicles and engines.

To achieve this, the Club organises and hold many regular and special events during the year which are advertised in the monthly newsletter that you as a member will receive. Those events include:

- General meetings followed by a social time with supper on the last Friday evening of each month.
- Monthly Club runs usually on the Sunday following the general meeting.
- Monthly mid week runs.
- Annual historical vehicle and machinery display at Lake Pertobe| on the second Sunday of January.
- Australia Day BBQ.
- Mothers Day lunch.
- Christmas in July outing and meal.
- Christmas party.

We would appreciate your active participation in as many as these events as possible especially the monthly club meetings. Also, many of the special events require volunteers to organise and set up and man and we would appreciate your assistance in these rather than just leaving it to a few people.

One of the main benefits of being a Club member is to make use of the Victorian Club Permit Scheme and obtain a "red plate" for your vehicle. The most important expectation of the Club is that members abide by the rules of that scheme. In particular you must fill out the Club Permit Logbook correctly on every day that the vehicle is taken out for a run and ensure that your registration is current. VicRoads may suspend or cancel a Club permit if a permit holder fails to comply with the permit conditions and repeated violations can affect the ability of a Club to continue to administer the scheme for the benefit of all other members. Should your club membership lapse you will no longer be registered on the Club Permit Scheme.

Name tags are available and members are encouraged to wear them at meetings and events so that we all get to know members names. Please see the Club Secretary if you would like to have one at minimal cost.

Please make the effort to become involved in our club. We appreciate that some members may have more available time than others, but you will find that involvement in our club will be very rewarding.

Membership Subscription Renewal Reminder

Membership renewal forms were sent out to all current members last month by email or attached to mailed newsletters. If you are reading this and don't have your renewal then email the club's email address or call Ian Rees.

Check that information on the form is correct; make changes as necessary and sign. Either scan and email it back to wdhvc@hotmail.com; or mail to the Club's P.O Box 560. We want to ensure that the Club's records are up to date. Annual subscription payment can be either by direct deposit into the Club's South West Credit account or by cheque in the mail. No cash. If you pay by direct deposit include your name and membership number as the reference.

The membership term is July 1st to June 30th. The annual subscription fee is \$70. Annual subscriptions are due and payable on July 1st and should be paid within one month. If paid after this the amount rises to \$95. VicRoads requires that people who have vehicles on Club Plates be financial members of their club. If you have not paid your membership subscription by July 1 it is advisable that you do not drive your vehicle on Club Plates until you have paid your subscription.

Update - USE OF CLUB PERMIT VEHICLES

The Victorian Government has announced an easing of COVID19 restrictions.

In addition to the reasons Victorians can leaving their home for: obtaining food and supplies, medical care and care giving, exercise, and work or education, Victorians can now attend social gatherings in their home with up to 5 visiting family or friends.

In addition, the outdoor recreations of walking groups, hiking, fishing and golf can be undertaken, with appropriate social distancing.

Club permit vehicles can be used during the current restrictions, but their use must only be in connection with one of the above activities (as well as being in accordance with the usual rules for use of club permit vehicles).

The Battery Drive is still on. Batteries can be left at the Dillon's or Chislett's farm, or at King Cole or call Andrew Serra and he will come and pick up. Thanks to everyone helping with this continuing fundraiser. The price is up at the moment so please keep them coming in.

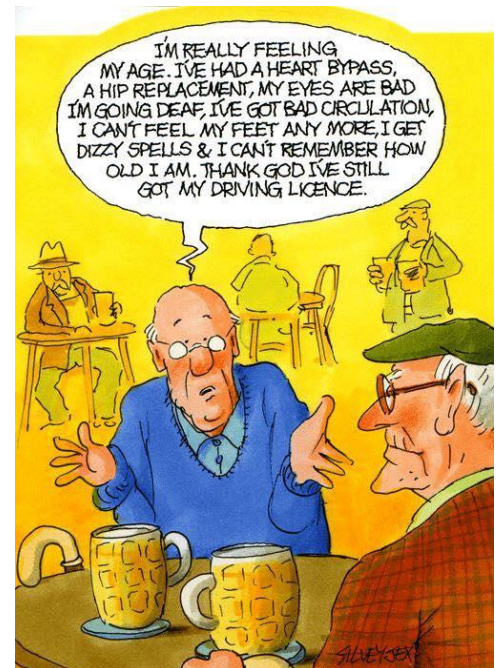
"What a horrible way to die!"



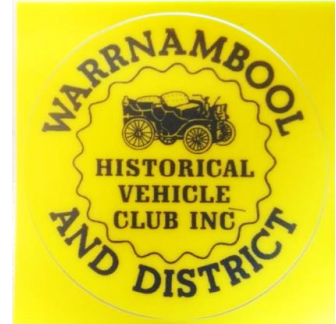

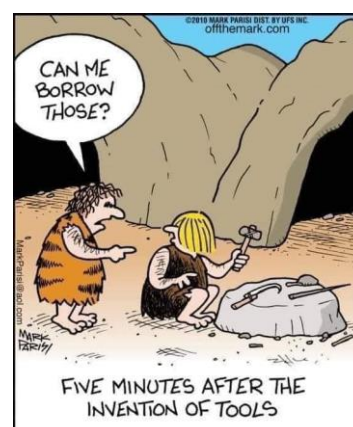
