

When and how to pay

A Club Member who has not paid their subscription by June 30th is no longer a financial member until it is paid. VicRoads requires that Club permit holders must ensure financial membership is maintained at all times whilst holding a club permit.

The member number is especially important for members with more common surnames such as Smith and Jones and Rachmaninov. Direct deposit is preferred as it saves time for the Treasurer having to bank cash and cheques at South West Credit.

Check the information on the form, especially contact details, revise if necessary, sign and even if there are no changes **return the form** either by email, mail or return at a Club event.






