Key design aspects agreed on were: a wall height of 3.6 m; colorbond cladding as per planning permit; allow for additional concrete slab thickness for future hoist; include concrete slabs for entry to PA doors and entry to vehicle access doors; include space for a unisex toilet, basic hand wash basin and sink; water supply to be rainwater tank. Subcommittee to update the scope of the shed build accordingly and get 3 updated quotes on a like for like basis for a bare shed and include cost of power supply to shed.

One of the 3 current options includes offer for Club volunteers to help construction to reduce cost and agreed to consider that, realising we will need builder's insurance. Committee will review when cost comparisons tabled and subsequently take to members at a General Meeting. Agreed to subsequently go out for bid for packages of work for concrete, plumbing and electrical.

Lake Goldsmith Steam & Vintage Rally 2021

For those who have never attended one of these events, it is thoroughly recommended. Located between Skipton and Beaufort, and described by the commentator as 'one of Australia's best kept secrets', the two day, bi-annual Lake Goldsmith Festival of Steam fired up for the incredible 117th time, on 1st & 2nd May, after a 12 month hiatus. Not only acclaimed as Australia's premier steam rally, it is also gaining international recognition.

And while you will see a lot of bearded blokes with greasy hands, the range of small and large engines, machinery and vehicles is amazing.

A Grand Parade, held on both days, is a real highlight with steam traction engines, steam cars, farm tractors, bulldozers, motorbikes, and ancient bicycles traversing a circular track, to an appreciative audience.

Having its very first showing, and attracting the most attention, was a newly restored, trailer mounted, 27 litre, V12 Rolls-Royce 'Merlin' engine. Built during WW2, these engines powered Spitfires, Hurricanes, Mustangs, Lancasters, Mosquitos and some were even converted for use in tanks. Almost 170,000 units were constructed, initially developing 1,000 bhp but by the end of production in 1950, developed over 2,000 bhp! A similar, trailer mounted, operable Merlin engine was sold in England a couple of years ago for 44,000 pounds!

Another attention-getter was the fully operational, 90 tonne Steam Shovel, which was transported to Lake Goldsmith in 1973 following its use at the Geelong Cement Works in Fyansford. Seven similar type steam shovels assisted in the construction of the Panama canal, completed in 1914.

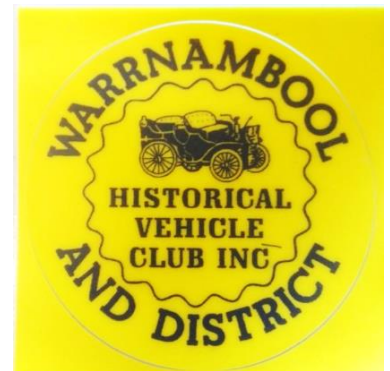

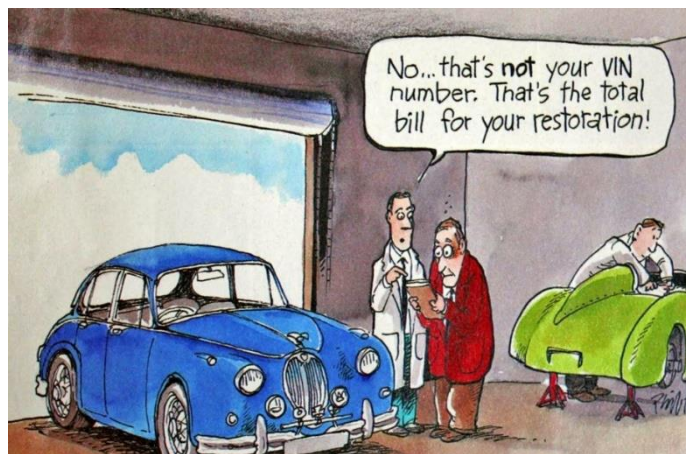
