

Vale – Jack Gore

Jack Gore, who was a founding member of the Club, passed away on June 15 at the age of 93.

Jack was one of the founding members of the Club and was a Life Member. Jack was involved at start of the Club and was a member of the steering committee formed in March 1973 to provide initial governance of the Club and was at the first meeting in March 1973. He was a member of the Club's Committee in that first year and a Treasurer for four of the early years. He was active in many roles and especially on the Committee in the first 20 years.

Jack's favourite marque was Chevrolet and he had among various models a 1926 Chev sedan and the 1954 210 model Chev sedan in the photo below. However in later years he relented and bought a 1973 LJ Torana and then a 1978 Kingswood station wagon to go on Roy's rallies.

Jack spent much of his working life with the Country Roads Board and was a bridge welder. In later years Jack and Ron Wilsher, who also worked for the CRB, were regular attenders at general meetings and came together. Both were also on the Engine Committee and regulars at CheeseWorld on the working bees right up until when he went into care at Opal. He still had plenty of disassembled engines and cars and plenty of gunna jobs!

Jack made history in the end being the first person to have a funeral at the new Clubrooms on June 18th. It was well attended by family and many of his friends at the Club and others.

WILLIAM JAMES EGAN

William James Egan was born at Bacchus Marsh in 1871, being the youngest of five children.

On 23 September 1913 he advertised in the 'Geelong Advertiser'.

W.Egan, Coach Builder, James-street, Geelong, has a large assortment of Buggies and Jinkers always on hand. Jinkers, from £18; Buggies from £26. A nice Piano Box with rubber tyres, low seat, £32/10/-. Agent for Flanders and K.M.F. 20 h.p. Motor Cars. Price £295. All Vehicles guaranteed for two years. New Cars for hire. 'Phone 1770.


(I was amazed that back in 1912 a two-year guarantee was given. – Graeme)

The Flanders and E.M.F. cars were built between 1908 and 1911 by Walter Emmett Flanders and his co-founders, Bernard F Everitt and William Metzger (E.M.F.)

Flanders had an interesting history as in 1905 he obtained a contract to produce 5,000 crankcases for Henry Ford and by 1906 he was Ford's production manager. He helped introduce mass production methods by arranging the layout of tools to improve efficiency. Others at Ford built on his ideas from 1908 to 1913 to develop the modern assembly line system.

In 1908 he left Ford and produced the E.M.F. 20 horsepower car. In its last year, 1911, the Flanders car ranked second to Ford. The E.M.F. and Flanders cars were sold through Studebaker distributors but in 1912 they were classed as Studebakers. In its three years of production the company had made 31,514 cars.

Walter Emmett Flanders was inducted into the 'Automobile Hall of Fame' in 1994.



The following year Egan advertised on 17 February 1914 in the 'Geelong Advertiser'.

Mr W.Egan, Carriage Builder of James-St. has had erected a special dust-proof varnish room for the painting and varnishing of motor cars; such a room is absolutely necessary in the finishing and durability of motor painting.

On 9 November 1915 this article appeared in the 'Geelong Advertiser'.

GEELONG'S FIRST MOTOR BODY

As an example of the possibilities of industrial expansion in Geelong, Mr.W.Egan is exhibiting in his carriage factory in James-street a completed motor body — the first built entirely in Geelong from materials supplied in this city. The order was placed by Mr. J.A.Carter, of Winchelsea, who supplied his own chassis. The body has been built of the best oak and is known as a streamline body, with the latest sloping torpedo bonnet. The panels are of beaten steel which, together with the nickel and iron work, was prepared on the premises. The bonnet and mud-guards are stove enamelled, the special process used by Mr. Egan being a prevention against chipping. The car throughout is upholstered in green, with electric lights, and the floor is covered with Brussels carpet. The whole design and finish is exceptionally neat and is a credit to local industry. The owner has allowed the car to remain on exhibition at Mr. Egan's for the next two days.

It was reported on 10 June 1916 that in a recent raffle, Mr. Allan Belcher won a motor-cycle side-car, built by Mr.W. Egan, of James-street, and re-donated it to the Red Cross fund. It was submitted to auction by Messrs. H. J. D'Helin and Co., under instructions from the Geelong War Funds Board, and was purchased for £9 by Mr. G. Hancock.

On Saturday 6 January 1923 the 'Geelong Advertiser' had a column titled BUSINESS REMINDERS.

'In our Wanted Known column today there is an advt. which will appeal to motor car owners. W.Egan James-street draws attention for his various departments. He builds bodies, he quotes for complete cars, he does repairs, he provides new hoods and re-covers. Enamelling is his strong suite. His stove takes the whole car, nothing else like it in Geelong. Electro-nickel and silver plating is done in all its branches.

On 1 June 1927 Mr. Egan made application to use portion of the right-of-way at the rear of his James-street premises.

The 'Argus' advertising the Jubilee International Motor Show to be held in the Exhibition Building stated on 8 June 1935

'Two cars manufactured in Geelong by the motor-body building firm of W.Egan will be another interesting exhibit.

Mr Egan said yesterday that he wanted to prove that cars could be built in Australia, and might later form a company to manufacture them in quantity.'

On that same day the 'Argus' published a road test of a "Baby" Austin Seven which featured a body built by W Egan of Geelong. The car was selling at a price of £254.

The 'Melbourne Herald' newspaper featured an article in its Motor Section on Monday 10 June 1935.

The title was **ALL-AUSTRALIAN STEEL CHASSIS**


EGAN-BUILT MODEL – Surprise From Geelong.

'Introducing an all-Australian cruciform X chassis made entirely from Broken Hill steel the Egan six will be released for the Motor Show.

Designed to withstand severe road conditions in all circumstances, the chassis provides a sturdiness comparable with its weight. It is a fine example of skilled Australian workmanship and affords an interesting comparison with overseas models.

Apart from the steel chassis frame component parts which have been manufactured in Australia include the radiator, shock absorbers, springs, silent rubber spring shackles, exhaust pipe and silencer box, parking brake, petrol tank, universal joints, tail shaft, gear fittings, bumper bars, clutch and brake controls, accelerator, Bendix brake fittings, hub caps and Corio batteries. The bodywork is also exclusively Australian including even the windscreen, mudguards, bonnet and running boards, all of which have been designed and completed in Egan's Works Geelong. Behind the construction of the car which is fitted with a six-cylinder Lycoming W.F. engine 22.5 h.p. and developing 85 h.p. at 3,500 r.p.m. is the lifetime experience in coach and car body building of the designer Mr. William Egan.

Under the mass production principal the Egan Works turned out 8,000 bodies in nine years. These included



the first 96 Australian-built sedan bodies used by the Ford Motor Company of Australia. The works have also specialised in individual orders in which a high standard has always been maintained.

To be built in several designs the first output of the factory, which will be on display at the Motor Show, is a gracefully streamlined five passenger sedan, beautifully finished and upholstered.

The output of Egan cars will be considerably restricted at first, because of the company's limited capacity, but it is confidently expected that the all-Australian car will win a popularity that will warrant an expansion.

Exceptionally long chassis springs, (front 38 inches, back 54½ inches) and a wheelbase of 120 inches provide comfortable travel in all conditions.'

(With a compression ratio of 6.2:1 a top speed of 80 mph was claimed)

Excerpts from an article from the 'Age' Friday 25 May 1934.

Is the All-Australian Car at Hand?

"A few years ago the motor car was wholly, or nearly so, a product of overseas countries, but now the greater proportion of its construction is achieved by industry in Australia. Most of the fine cars and commercial vehicles on view at the show are largely products of that industry, which gives employment to thousands of Australian workmen. Very few models are wholly imported articles.

In the great majority of cases the engine and chassis are brought in unassembled form from overseas, but from the time of their landing in Australia they provide work for people in this country.

It may be that the advent of the all-Australian car is nearer at hand than most people would suspect. On an obscure stand of the lower floor at the show there is exhibited an attractive car which has been completely built locally except for the ignition. Known as the Buckingham 60, this car – a coupe – is constructed of Australian metal, with inside panelling of Tasmanian blackwood and upholstery of Australian leather. The engine was made at Footscray, and the elegant streamlined body is a product of Egan's body works, Geelong - one of the first industries to manufacture motor bodies in Australia."

The death of William James Egan was reported in the 'Age', Melbourne on Wednesday 21 August 1946.

OBITUARY - MR. W. J. EGAN

Mr. William James Egan, 75 years, died at his home in Tyrone-street, Ormond, during the week end. He was one of the pioneers of the motor-body building industry in Australia, and he was well known throughout the industry during 40 years of service at Geelong. In 1935 Mr. Egan was instrumental in constructing a number of six-cylinder cars, which are still operating throughout Australia.

A keen golfer, he was a member of the Geelong golf club. He is survived by his widow and one daughter.

(As this obituary was written in 1946 it would be interesting to know in this day and age whether any of these six-cylinder cars still exist!)






