Club Committee Report for 2021 AGM

Another year dealing with COVID 19! There were no general meetings last year for eight months until November 2020 when we restarted and continued until July 2021 with another lockdown. The Committee kept functioning during lockdowns by email and phone until we met again in November. The 2020 AGM was also not able to be attended in person but we sent out reports, notices of motion and voting forms and the annual election was carried out in September with a few Committee members and scrutineers at the Clubrooms to count votes. During lockdowns our Newsletter Editor was compiling the newsletter but there were a lot of blanks in the calendar of events.

In November 2020 events started again with the mid-week coffee runs and Club runs. In December we had the Christmas party at the Clubrooms. After negotiations with the local Council and Victorian Health Dept we were able to have our display at Lake Pertobe in January. However, it had to be just cars and no fences or BBQ. All went well and there were 112 cars on display. That was followed by Australia Day BBQ, Bunnings BBQ in February and mother's day lunch at the Clubrooms. Unfortunately for those members who look forward every year to the Bendigo and Ballarat swap meets, they were cancelled due to concerns about the potential impact of COVID restrictions.

By June 2021 just prior to membership subscription renewal the Club's membership was about 390. That is slightly above the same time in 2019 so COVID has not affected membership. With subs renewals completed this August there have been about 24 members who have resigned or passed away and membership is about 375. We welcome recent new members and hope that you meet new friends at the Club and get involved with our activities.

Since July 2020 the Club has had an unusually high number of members who have passed away. They included Cob Owen, Ron Wilsher, Miriam Welton, Jack Gore (Foundation member), Wendy Boyle, George Politis and Aileen Morgan. Jack's funeral was held at the clubrooms. Vale to all those members and many being long term members.

At the Clubrooms, finishing work was conducted with the installation of blinds, the purchase of a refrigerator, microwave, vacuum cleaner and 12 bifold tables courtesy of a grant from the Warrnambool City Council. Repairs were carried out on the roof above the kitchen as a leak caused damage to a portion of the kitchen ceiling. In mid-2021 work commenced on the room intended to be the enlarged Committee Room and combine it with the adjacent small bathroom. Other projects started were the tidy up of the outside to make it a covered BBQ area and also creation of a paved area out front by the entrance made possible with a kind donation of bluestone pavers.

In the beginning of 2021 a subcommittee was formed to look at the scope and cost of building a shed in the northwest of the property as conceptually approved in the original planning permit. Scoping work continues.

The financial position of the Club is secure. In late 2020 the outstanding balance of the loan was paid off and saved about \$500 in interest charges. Also, the number of members receiving the newsletter by mail has continued to drop in the last year and is now about 70 and saves another \$700 per year. The COVID lockdowns did however have an impact on revenue and especially because a BBQ was not possible at Lake Pertobe. Calendar sales are always a good source of extra income and due to demand 180 were printed and sold for the 2021 year and 200 are being printed for 2022. Scrap batteries have also been a good fundraiser.

All Club Members benefit from about 30 key volunteers mainly in office bearer positions running the Club. The President, Treasurer, Committee, Safety Check Officers, Property Officer, Newsletter Ed, Federation Rep, Catering Committee, those doing maintenance and work on the Clubrooms plus others put in many hours of unpaid work. Thank you for the efforts of those volunteers this past year including those who are retiring. This year we need volunteers in particular for the vacant positions of **Club Captain** and a Federation Representative. If you have the time please contact someone on the Committee.

Federation Zoom Meeting – 7/8/2021

- Financial- \$11,562.05 cr Balance 9/8/21
- Vintage Motorcycle Club run at Maryborough over Labour weekend had 60 entrants at the last one. There has been up to 120 entrants previously and has been going for 50 years.
- CPS – There was a report in the Age newspaper about CPS saying that people are getting cheap Rego and not doing the right thing. The Report did not include that it is estimated that the spend by the Movement is well over 1 Billion Dollars. Slimline plates, same number replacement plates and replacement same number slimline plates are now available. Information can be found on Vicroads website.
- Bendigo Swap Meet has been cancelled. This was discussed at length. It has been resolved that the financial outlay to set it up and then be cancelled at the last minute would devastate the savings of the Federation and Bendigo Clubs. The financial risks of arranging it to make a small profit were too great. There would be \$100,000 invested before the Swap to make \$20,000 - \$30,000 profit. It has been noticed that since 2019 Swap about ¼ of site holders did not renew their site booking. Some maybe getting too old or cannot find stock. Thinking about having a Car Show the Swap weekend instead of the Marong Picnic. They can fit 200-250 cars in the sheds. Estimated \$5000 - \$6000 to run then have a market on Sunday. Want to know what Clubs and Members think.
- Working on having a Decades display each year. Eg- one year have 1931-1941 then following year have next decade.
- Bendigo to Castlemaine event 28/8/21 - Cancelled.
- Marong picnic 29/8/21 - Cancelled.
- Baw Baw October – still proceeding.
- AHMF Zoom Meeting in September.
- March 2022- Face to face meeting in Canberra. It is important to get close to Politicians to discuss the Movement in general. More importantly, the move to electric vehicles in 2030 and supply of fuel and the price of it.
- The AGM was held. Federation Financially strong and balance in surplus.

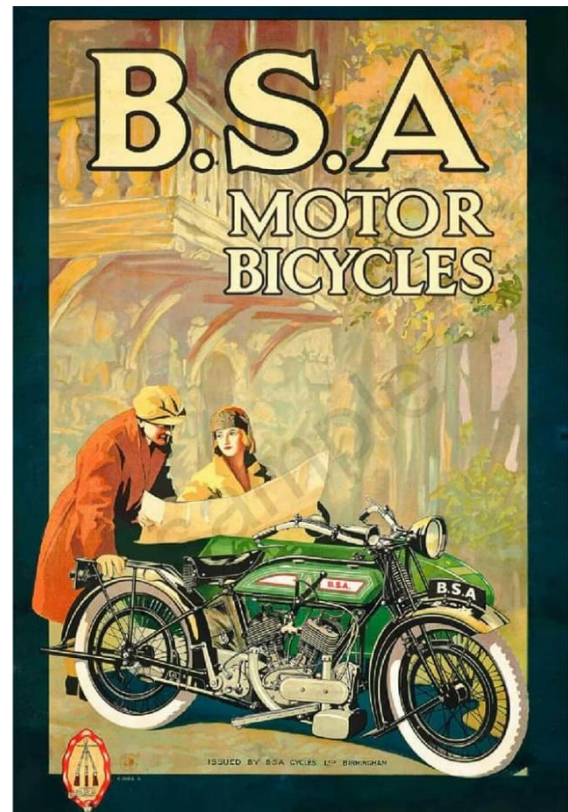

DELAGES TO DARWIN OR BUST!

It might be the Viking blood that encourages Erik Carlsson to be adventurous. He recently joined fellow vintage Delage owners in a 4,000km, month long rally from Adelaide to Darwin as a challenge, which was also in aid of the Royal Flying Doctor Service.

The Rally was organised by fellow Club member, Delage devotee and restoration mentor David Rentsch and was to be held 12 months ago but Coronavirus concerns got in the way and it was re-organised, and held last month.

As with all car rallies there were the usual breakdowns and anxious moments. Erik headed off from Warrnambool with a very noisy exhaust caused by a big backfire the day before and had frightened every living creature by the time he got to Murray Bridge and had to replace his muffler to prevent further animal cruelty. Others had breakdowns and spoke highly of the RACV Roadside Assist. And the requisite border passes and lockdowns in South Australia and the Northern Territory caused by Co-vid 19 created extra dilemmas.

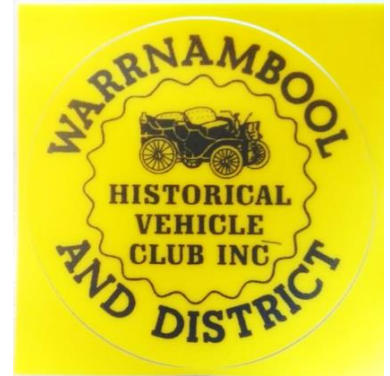

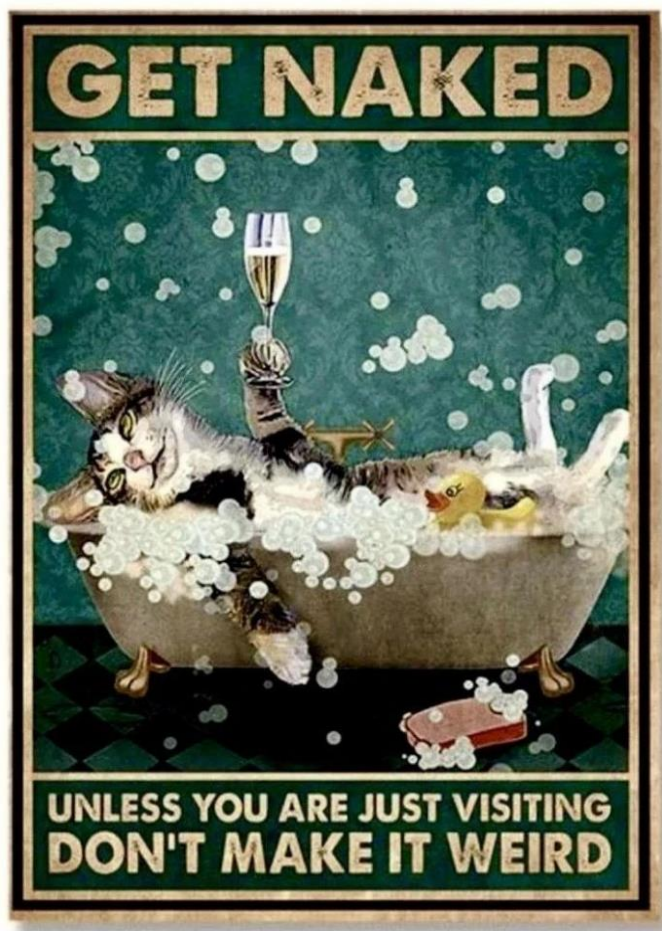
