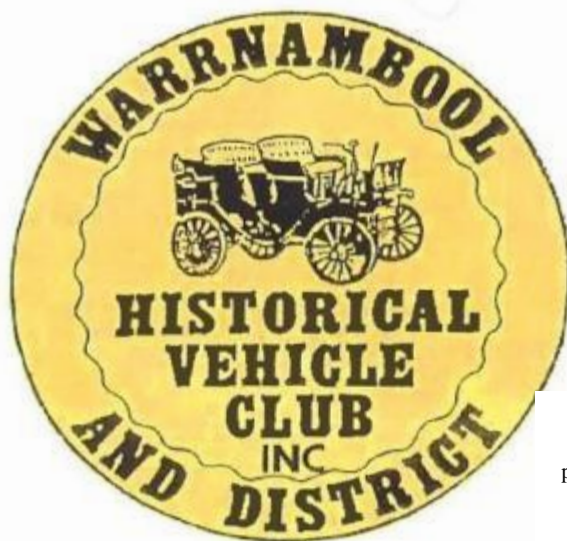

Mrs. Foyle was thrown violently from her seat and sustained a nasty shaking, and Mr. Foyle also had a severe fall, but fortunately escaped injury. The little girl was struck by portion of the machine, knocked down, and received some cuts and scratches.

Cancelling luxury car tax on historic vehicles was met with the answer from Treasury that taxes collected were used to maintain national roads for us to enjoy.

The most important task for the AHMF is zero emission requirements. We need to decide on what we as members of the movement can and should do. Do we offer to plant trees to create carbon offsets?

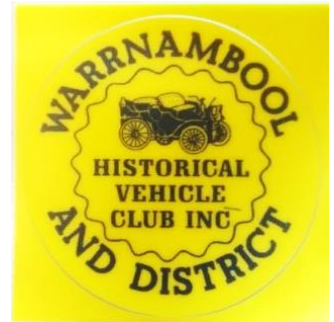

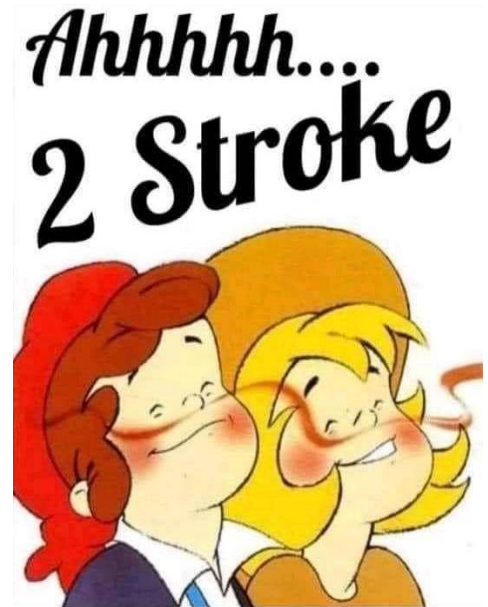
