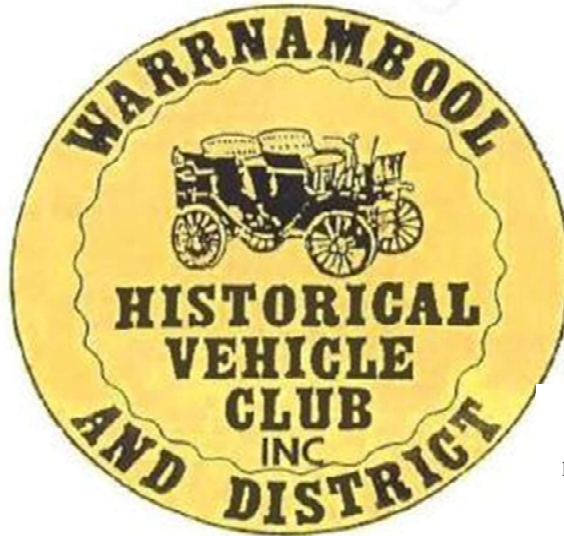

Note: Due to prevailing COVID 19 pandemic restrictions on gatherings, the AGM was conducted by mail out of the resolutions required by the Club's Constitution plus reports and voting forms for Club Officer positions to all members on the membership roster as of August 2021. Annual Report of Club Committee for 2022 AGM

COVID restrictions continued to affect meetings and events in the last half of 2021. There was no general meeting in October but from November on the general meetings, committee meetings, mid-week and end of month club runs all got back to a semblance of normal and in December we had the Christmas party at the Clubrooms.

The Lake Pertobe car display went ahead in January after negotiations with the Warrnambool City Council about appropriate COVID restrictions. The display included 85 vehicles and despite no fences or BBQ and we were pleased with the turnout of vehicles and donations raised for charity. Local and out of town Austin Seven car owners brought their cars and were the highlight which celebrated 100 years since the first Austin Seven was introduced in 1922.

A Bunnings BBQ was held in March and raised over \$900. Thanks to the volunteers who manned the BBQ.

About 25 new members joined the Club in the past 12 months and at the end of this June just prior to membership subscription renewal the Club's membership was about 390 which is the same as June last year. We welcome recent new members and hope that you meet new friends at the Club and get involved with our activities.

Since July 2021 the Club has lost members who have passed away including Rick Frewin, Leslie McDonald, Colin Williams, Jean Smith, and John Ryan. Vale to all those members.

Volunteers were busy all year working on various upgrade projects in and around the Clubrooms.

- The Committee room has now had been combined into one room with the old toilet and internal wall removed. Shelves and storage for office files, consumables and office equipment has been installed.
- The pebble garden in the front of the Clubrooms has been removed and replaced with bluestone paving.
- A ziptrak blind was installed to allow separation of the kitchen from the main meeting room. That was partly funded by a bequest from the late Aileen Morgan.
- Landscaping and garden establishment was completed in the dividing strip in the parking area.
- A section of the southern boundary fence was replaced in conjunction with the affected neighbour.
- Tidy up of the BBQ area started with a clean-up and, after consultation with members, a redevelopment plan has been agreed. A generous donation from the will of Cob Owen will be used to fund the work.

Thanks to all volunteers who have spent many hours working on those projects.

The financial position of the Club is secure. The operating profit is consistent with previous years.

March 2023 will be the Club's 50th anniversary and a subcommittee was established in April to plan a celebration to be held at the end of next March. Bryan O'Meara is the chair of the subcommittee and with other volunteers has begun planning for the scope of events including a dinner and a rally.

The President, Treasurer, Committee, Safety Check Officers, Property Officer, Newsletter Editor, Federation Reps, Catering Committee, those doing maintenance and work on the Clubrooms plus others put in many hours of unpaid work. Thank you for the efforts of those volunteers this past year including those who are retiring. Peter and Karen Carter, Martin Dunstan and Roy Begelhole will not be standing again for the Committee. Ken Perrett will have served three years as President and won't be standing again. The Club again did not have a Club Captain this past year and it has negatively impacted on forward planning of monthly Club runs. The Club needs volunteers to run the Club so please consider whether you can volunteer at the AGM for the Committee and other positions.

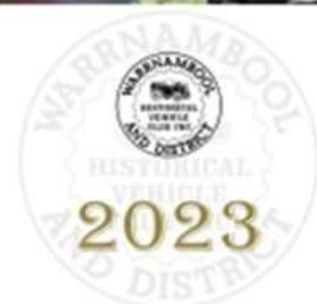
