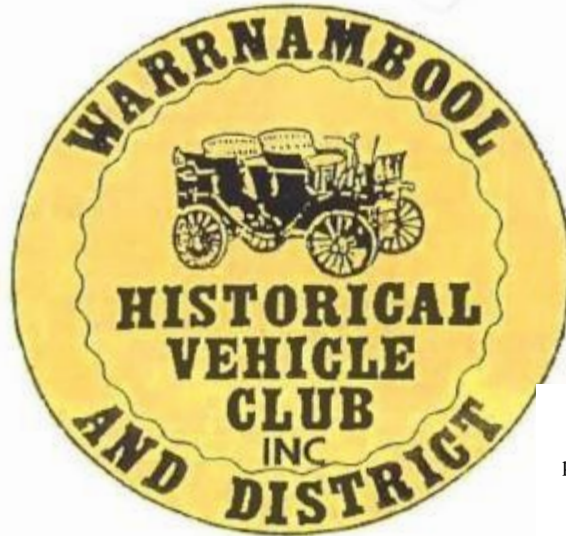

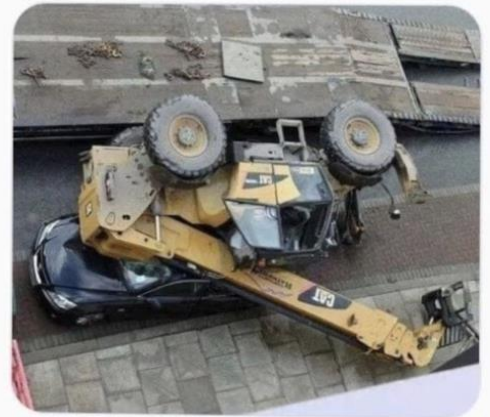

RACV Four and More Rally – Beechworth: September 8-11 Murray Murfett's 1911 Buick on its maiden rally

Murray and his brother, Evan, took his 1911 Buick up to Beechworth on a car trailer on the 8th for the start of the Four and More Rally (that's 4 cylinders and more). There were 24 pre 1918 vehicles on the tour with 6 including Murray rallying the Buick for the first time. There was a shakedown run the afternoon of 8th and then Friday 9th was over to Tallangatta to meet up with local people and visit a clock repair shop in town. Saturday was a big run day going from Beechworth to Mt Beauty and return for a total of 200 km. There were no problems with the Buick, but it was wet and a bit hilly and a lot chilly. Photo shows both with their aviator style lined headwear to keep out the cold. On the uphill section going to visit John Stanley's Stoewer collection just out of Mt Beauty, the Buick performed well except that it was passed by a Model T. At times the Buick got up to 55 km/h which in a small open car felt like 55 mph. It rained quite a bit and one of the learnings is that there needs to be a drain hole in the floor! Last day of the rally was on the Sunday 11th and they packed up and put the Buick back onto the trailer for the 7-hour drive back home. Well done Murray for an inaugural run after many years of restoration to bring the car back to original status.

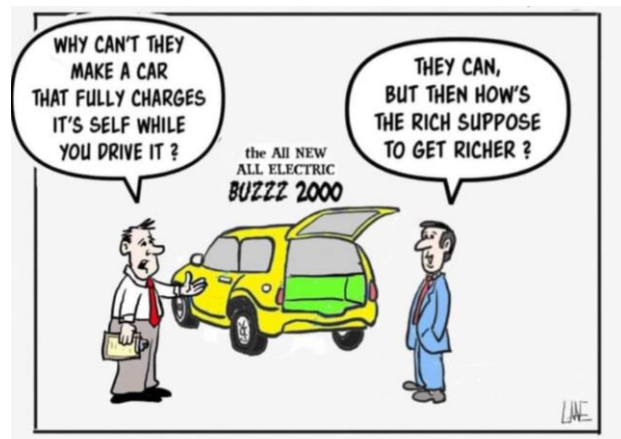

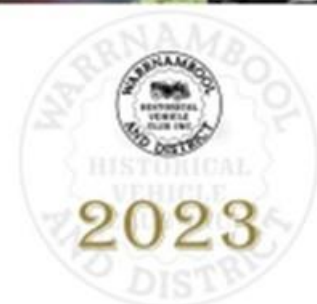


