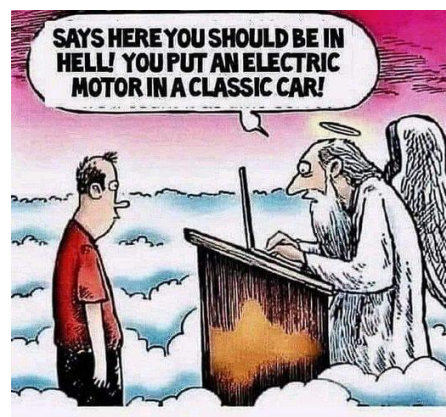
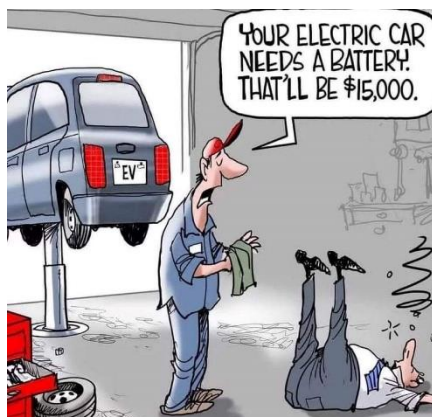

Motorclassica October 2022



At well over 100 years young, this Buick Model 32 Runabout has some incredible tales to tell and remarkably, they are primarily focused geographically close to Motorclassica.

Initially, the car was used at the time of its purchase as a daily commute between Melbourne city and Hawthorn, as owned by the Manager of the Melbourne Photographic Co.

At that time, Buicks were more plentiful than Fords; a total of 13,389 Buicks were produced in 1911, although only 1,150 were Model 32s.

Despite this popularity at the time, less than 10 examples of this model remain worldwide today.

This vehicle was rescued in the 1960s from Inglewood, just outside of Bendigo, in a poor state, with missing components including the back axle, radiator and lights, while white ants and borers had enjoyed numerous picnics feasting on the wooden body.

Restoration of the Buick began eight years ago, reviving it into its original condition.

Originally sold for \$800 in the USA, and marketed as capable of 'standing more hard use and abuse than any light runabout ever offered for sale', one would assume the vehicle has substantially appreciated in value over the past century.

Owned and restored by our club member Murray Murfett.

Jon Narik: Moved to approve membership application: Geoff Houston; 2nd Ted Drake. Carried.

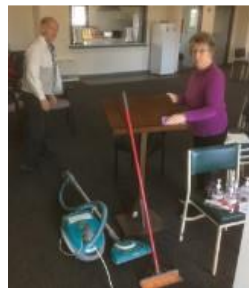
