



## Guest Speaker for January 27th General Meeting Everyone is welcome!



We have a guest speaker arranged for the general meeting on January 27<sup>th</sup>. **Donna Koik** is the Heart Matters Coordinator for Warrnambool. She will speak to us for about 30 minutes about recognising and responding to heart attack warning signs.

Heart Matters is a partnership project with Heart Foundation, Ambulance Victoria and Monash University that aims to save lives through community education about the warning signs of heart attack, what to do if you or someone close to you has those warning signs, and how to reduce your risk of having a heart attack.

The Warrnambool community is known to be at high risk of heart attack, we have low heart health knowledge, and often don't call an Ambulance when we should. Heart Matters wants to change those statistics — we want to save lives. We want our community members to recognise and respond quickly to heart attack warning signs, and to know and manage their risk of having a heart attack.

Donna is a Warrnambool Community member who joined this project because she knows the Heart Matters message will save lives in our community. She is also an active volunteer with the St John Ambulance, Warrnambool Division, Teacher, Trainer, and Assessor within this community.

## Warrnambool's Railway Turntable.

Many W&DHVC members may not be aware that the club played a considerable role in returning a railway turntable to Warrnambool. Norman Houghton's recently published excellent book To Warrnambool Stopping all Stations, indicates a turntable was installed in 1890 when rail reached Warrnambool and was extensively used literally every day to turn steam locomotives around to undertake a return journey to Melbourne or position engines within the once busy railyard. However, the Warrnambool Standard of 12 October 1915 states "Yesterday the ponderous parts of a new railway turntable arrived at Warrnambool to be erected on the site of the present turntable, near the local engine sheds. (i.e., near the present concrete batching site well west of the station). The turntable is built to accommodate the large AA express engines which will shortly be employed running regularly on the line between Melbourne and Port Fairy," With the introduction of diesel engines in the 1970's, which could be driven from either end, there was no longer the need for a turntable and Warrnambool's was sold, presumably for scrap metal, and removed. In the late 1980's a small but determined group of civic minded train enthusiasts embraced on a major project the likes of which had rarely before been seen in in Australia. They planned to move a 25-tonne locomotive turntable from Mornington to Warrnambool where it would be restored to enable historic steam trains to once again grace the Melbourne - Warrnambool line. The turntable was donated by Steamrail Victoria but not before Mornington suddenly realised what they were losing and fought a battle to retain it. At 21.3 metres long and weighing 25 tonnes, the turntable needed two cranes to lower it to its temporary resting place. The W&DHVC was one of a number of community groups involved in the \$30,000 project. Considerable earth and concrete work were required in the positioning of the turntable in its new position. Jack Brittain and Ray Farley, along with other early members of the club were closely involved in many facets of the project and the club can deservedly be considered a significant contributor to what was achieved.

The turntable was officially "christened" on April 7, 1990, to coincide with the opening of the Warrnambool – Melbourne train line centenary celebrations. Things did not go smoothly though as after the Mayor, Toni McCormack, cracked a bottle of pink champagne over an engine's nose, the manual "driven" turntable refused to budge! After about an hour of fruitless efforts to get it moving, the engine was driven off the turntable the way it steamed on to run two 40-minute joyride trips west to Dennington. After the two Dennington journeys, the strength of a council machine and a winch were brought in to lend support and so the stage was set for the engine to head off down the right track for the return trip to Melbourne.

The Warrnambool Standard reported that "Engineer and volunteer worker Jack Brittain said he was disappointed the event did not go off unhitched." The turntable is now listed as a Warrnambool City Council asset, leased to Victrack, and has proved its worth many times since installation with steam train tourist trips now a regular occurrence, particularly under the watchful eye of Allansford local and Steamrail Victoria stalwart Eddie White (on the right). It is recorded though that at times it has had to be "encouraged" to do its job despite a having a small motor installed in 2004 to drive it.

To comply with the Victorian Motor Car Traders Regulations 2008, all advertisements for used motor cars must state:

- (a) The cash price; and
- (b) If the motor car is registered, the registration number; and
- (C) If the motor car is unregistered the engine number of the vehicle; or the chassis number of the vehicle; or the vehicle identification number; or the registration number (if any) last assigned to the vehicle; or if none of those numbers is reasonably ascertainable, any other number by which the vehicle may be identified.




