

The club's 1967 Rambler Rebel 770 Limousine Story.

The late Alan Leslie Lane O.A.M, was an astute Warrnambool businessman whose enterprises included Lane's Bus Services. He was also on the city council for some time and in 1975 established the A. L Lane Foundation, a philanthropic trust. Around this time, he purchased two second hand 9 seat V8 Rambler stretched limousines. One had been damaged in a railway crossing accident. He planned to use them as part of his bus service, but the story goes that the authorities of the day said only if he welded up the two doors behind the driver's seat - it never happened! W&DHVC member Ken Perrett told the Warrnambool Standard in 2017 "I think there was only 4 ever made in America and we don't know if the other two still exist. This is definitely the only one in Australia." Member Keith Begley, can remember the vehicles sitting in Lane's premises while decisions where being made. It is believed motors were swapped and the serviceable vehicle was used to some extent including promotional work such as advertising Warrnambool when the limo followed the 1977 Sun cycling tour of Victoria. After Alan Lane's passing in 1995, the Foundation had local tradesmen extensively restore the Rambler and in association with the city council used and or stored the limo until 2006 when the Foundation trustees approached the W&DHVC about taking it over. The club negotiated a deal and in early 2007 accepted the offer which included that the Foundation continue to cover expenses incurred such as registration, insurance and repairs. It has subsequently been garaged at a WCC storage facility, in a garage at Dennington courtesy late Colin Williams, and more recently garaged thanks to Ken Perrett. Perhaps one day it will be garaged much closer to our clubrooms?

Since the Rambler has been with the club it has been used to take members as far a field as Mt Gambier for "Around the Garages" and is also popular when the club takes folk from centres such as Lyndoch on excursions. Drivers who have volunteered to take it on the road certainly know it's a bit different to a four-seater! It has had several mechanical "tweakings" but nothing that has caused too much stress and it is hoped it can remain a flagship of the club for some years to come. Some information, gathered from various sources include - Built in Kenosha, Wisconsin, USA and shipped to Australia in RHD configuration. V8 343 cu in engine with 2-barrel Carter carburettor. The last restoration involved local tradesmen including, Morses – undercar, front and backsprings, differential etc. Whitehead's – Automatic transmission. McCullagh's – engine rebuild. I. Amoore – electrical work. D. McConnell – panel and paint work. R. Hoy – upholstery. WCC – assembly work.

Federation Meeting Minutes - 11th February 2023

Geoff Gwilym CEO from VACC was guest speaker on the future of the Classic vehicle. Despite being approached by VACC about the number of unroadworthy vehicles coming through VACC workshops, the Victorian Government isn't interested in Annual Roadworthys as no votes in it.

Electric vehicles- Federal Gov. wants 90%, State Gov. 50% of new vehicles electric by 2030. VACC thinks more like 30%. Next year of about 1.1 million cars imported 10% will be electric & hybrid. In the near future there will be a Road users tax & carbon tax. Geoff has had Meeting with Gov. advisers here and overseas. The young people at these meetings seem to have no interest in fossil fuel vehicles or the car movement. In his opinion these are the people that will need to have a positive on these matters. He thinks there will be interest in older vehicles in the future as people will still want to dismantle and put back together vehicles. It takes 12-15 years to have any changes put through Government.

BENDIGO SWAP: I have been trying to get a meeting with our local MP Jacinta Allan, City Council Major Events Director Terry Karamaloudis and Show Society Secretary Ian Furze. What I hope to achieve at this meeting is that if we are 6 weeks out from the Swap then it's locked in that the time we have the grounds booked will not change no matter what. Also as Jacinta is Chair of Commonwealth Games we need assurances that we will not be that affected by the games. Building a new 50 x 30 meter shed near gate 3 is something we can cope with. Swap loss of \$40,000
