

To all not feeling well, I hope you are feeling better soon.




### Mount Gambier Club trip - October - 14th & 15th 2023

Peter Mac Hospital Fundraiser: This was an excellent fundraiser that all Federation member clubs undertook in 2023. **BENDIGO SWAP**: Three applications for financial relief following last year's cancellation have been rejected by the State Government. We were working with MP Maree Edwards's office trying to get the \$20,000 that we lost due to the 2022 cancellation back from the Government. No success due no infostructure damage. The building of a new Sports/Entertainment facility on the stables area at an estimated cost of over \$25million is still proceeding. We can cope with this and we believe now it will impact the 2024 Swap.

#### Back to the actual Swap in 2023:

All sites are booked out and the site holder's information and requirements has been handed to the printers in preparation of the mail out of tickets early October. A little later than I hoped for but it is the windscreen stickers for site holders that is the concern. Tickets and wrist bands are on the way and renewals. Volunteer wrist bands have been sent. The feature will be Barn Finds cars or Survivor Cars. Thank you to the Clubs who responded to the call for more workers for Volunteers list over Swap Weekend. Ted is sending out all of the information to each Volunteer mid-October. It's not too late if you still have names to add to the list. Advertising is well underway in the Just Cars magazines. Restored cars and on WWW sites. There will be a push locally with radio ads. We have enquired with 7 Mate TV regarding special ads for the event but no reply.

Our Insurance cover has been renewed at a slightly higher cost over 2022 event. That is understandable.

All the contracted hire in requirements and specialized contractors for additional toilets, security, cleaning are all in place. CFA will look after the Main and Gate one entry and Parts Pick up. There are flyers and please take them and hand them around at your Clubs, Displays and events. The promotion of the Swap is a Federation task for all members clubs to assist with. We are looking for a local business or member from the Federation Community that is conversant with Computer Programme writing to maintain the special one off programme that the Swap Sites bookings is run under.

**AHMF UPDATE:** The AHMF met a few weeks ago in Brisbane at their AGM. There were Reps from QLD, NSW, VIC & SA. Trying to get WA, NT & Tas on board. David Burner was re-elected President. Thank you to Neville Laurner, John Goddard and David Burner for going along to the AGM. We now have David, Neville and John on the Robert Shannon Trust Committee. Clubs are urged to look within your membership for a possible applicant to this trust.






