

VALE LINTON SANDERS

The recent passing of long-term member Linton Sanders causes reflection on the many roles he played in our club. Linton became a member in 1979 and was a committee member from 1981 for many years. His involvement in many displays and fund-raising activities towards the club obtaining the original clubrooms in South Warrnambool were very much appreciated. The "Murweh" days and the "Brierly" display day owed much to his assistance and he was the chief organiser of the "J R Brown" day at Hopkins Point which, according to a report in The Standard, saw about 2000 attending.

Linton had involvement with his father, Len, in some car outings until eyesight problems caused him to lessen his club involvement. He also displayed stationary engines with his father in law, Lindsay Pitter.

In 1980 Linton took on the role of printing the newsletter with a newly-purchased electric duplicator. He continued in the role of printer and collator until 1984 when he also added the task of co-editor with Charlie Speed. For 1985 he shared the editorial load with Ron Wormald. The following year he co-edited with Neville Hoy and the next year with Doug Abbott. In 1988 he teamed with Francis Gore. He continued with the printing and collating of the newsletter until October 1991.

Our club has been very fortunate to have had members such as Linton and we can look back on his valuable contribution and companionship.

Veterans at Lake Pertobe

These two 'brass' veteran cars are having their first outing at Lake Pertobe on January 14th. The bright red 4-cylinder 1914 Stellite (made by Wolseley) is owned by Port Fairy members Michael and Bernadette Mathews and was only acquired a few months ago. A very rare model, it has wooden chassis rails. The green 2-cylinder 1909 Renault was not only having its first outing, but also the first time it had been out on public roads since being acquired by Murray Murfett a few months ago. Previously owned for 4 years by Erik Carlsson, it was originally restored more than 40 years ago, and has lots of 'patina'. The 1915, twin-cylinder Excelsior 'Big X' (partly hidden) was owned by former member, the late Jack Murfett from Terang, who passed it onto motorcycle enthusiast Barry Murfett (Murray's cousin) who has kept it in its very original condition. He rode it down from Maldon for the weekend. At the right-hand side of this image and showing its rear end only, (and still on the trailer after being pulled out of a barn in remote NSW) is Erik Carlsson's very recently acquired 1924 Delage. This created a lot of interest, as unrestored vintage vehicles such as this are becoming increasingly rare.

Lake Pertobe Vehicle Display – January 14th

Our annual display day went very well with many volunteers coming early to set up the site with bollards, bunting, signs, donation bins, gazebo and the bbq and marshal the vehicles onto the display area. Over 100 vehicles were on display including 97 cars, 3 motor bikes and 2 trucks. The theme was 100 years of MG. The weather was great, lots of people came through and viewed the displays, bought food and drink at the bbq gazebo, and made donations to our nominated recipient. This year the donations are going to Legacy since the organisation was founded 100 years ago in the aftermath of the Great War. Warrnambool has one of 44 Legacy Clubs in Australia and helps veterans' families carry on with their lives after the loss or injury of their loved ones. The gate donations as well as from Beyond Bank and Callaghans will be presented to a representative of local Legacy at our March general meeting.

We had some corporate sponsors with once again Browns Bakery donating bread for the bbq, Falcon Traffic lent us bollards used to fence off the boundaries of our display area and Bade Ness Rural lent us gates to fence off the stationary engine display area. The theme was 100 years on MG and Calaghan Motors who sell the modern version of MG had some of their MGs on display and will contribute to the Legacy Donation. Beyond Bank manager Grant Howland helped on the bbq and the bank also has chipped in money for the Legacy donation money.






