

FEDERATION MEETING – FEBRUARY 2024

2023 Events Outcomes:

Baw Baw Picnic: on the 29th October 2023. This is a great event and lots to see in the display shed and surrounds.

December 3rd Central Victorian Restoration Group is holding a display at the Prince of Wales Show Ground in conjunction with the show grounds market on Sunday morning. This event celebrated 100 years of Farmall Tractors. Twenty Five tractors were on display along with historic vehicles, buses, trucks and stationary engines. Two Howard make tractors were also on display as they were celebrating 100 years of manufacture in 2023.

2024 Events:

Mortlake Picnic- Sunday 24th March. This will be the 20'th Mortlake picnic. Local Shire is assisting with this milestone event. Excellent day to come and relax and enjoy the terrific vehicles on display. Lots of prizes to give away.

Wunghnu Vehicle, Machinery and Collectables Display: Next year's date will be 30th & 31st March. This is over Easter weekend but don't let that stop you going as you will be well looked after. The event will celebrate 100 years of Farmall tractors. This is always a great event and this year they will have a demonstration of sheep dog trials.

Murrabit Picnic 19th May – First time for this event and it will be a terrific display with lots of interesting local vehicles on display. This is the day after the Delegates meeting in Kerang and a chance to make a full weekend of historic motoring. Please see flyer enclosed.

This is also National Motoring Day for the AHMF across the country.

Marong Picnic Sunday 25th August – Usual picnic activities at this event. Please see flyer enclosed. Neil to investigate other locations for the run to be held the day prior to this picnic day.

Golden Oldies Tour 2024: Entries are now at 45 and there are still a lot of people who have let Anne know they will be entering that haven't! Accommodation will be tight – the plan is for 2 nights in Maryborough, 2 nights in Daylesford and 3 nights in Ballarat which will minimize the number of motel changes. Although the places are not geographically that far away from each other, the plan is to go the long way. Anne is now working on arranging the meals and what we will all get to see on the tour.

The tour will leave the Marong Picnic on 25th August and finishes on 1st September. RACV will be the major sponsors once more. Entry form is on the Federation site and includes suggested accommodation. Baw Baw Picnic Sunday 20th October – This is the date for the 2024 event. The Delegates meeting will be held the day prior to this event making it another great historic motoring weekend.

Peter Mac Hospital Fundraiser: This was an excellent fundraiser that all Federation member clubs undertook in 2023. Looking forward to March 2024 and all Federation Clubs are asked once again to undertake an activity in their area to raise funds for this great organization. We have some collection tins. Please let me know if your club is going to be involved. There will be a display at Bendigo Show Grounds on the 7 th April. At the Delegates meeting we will have collection tins for Delegates to take back to their clubs.

BENDIGO SWAP: The show grounds was used again for Flood Relief and for packing Sand Bags during January 2024. The building of a new Sports/Entertainment facility looks like has been cancelled. The Show Committee have asked if we will meet with them soon to discuss other building plans they have. We have raised with Show Society that their showers near FJ's Café were substandard and they have agreed to rectify those before 2024 Swap. A\$750 refund has been received.

Back to the actual Swap in 2023:

All sites were booked out from the 2019 bookings by site holders at that swap and before COVID took over early in 2020. Plus site bookings made since then. Regretfully there we around 80 sites not used over the weekend despite people holding bookings for them and site tickets being sent out and not returned. Those Site Holders who did not use their sites will be asked why and if we receive no reply or a good excuse then the sites will go to the next ones on the waiting list. The feature will be Barn Finds cars or Survivor Cars attracted some interest. We will have them on display in various parts of the Swap in 2024 plus looking at Chryslers and MG who both reach the 100 years milestones in 2024. Thank you to the Clubs who responded to the call for more workers for Volunteers list over Swap Weekend. Ted was happy with the response from Clubs and the number of volunteers who put their names down to assist. Advertising was carried out in the Just Cars magazines, Restored cars and on WWW sites. There was also a push locally with radio ads. We did have the live cross over on radio Saturday morning. Looking to build on more ads in 2024. All the contracted hire in requirements and specialized contractors for additional toilets, security, cleaning and CFA will look after the Main and Gate one entry and Parts Pick up. These all worked well. Couple of break downs with mobile toilets which we hope will be rectified. The Financial results of the 2023 Swap will be known at the May meeting. There are flyers for 2024 Swap here today. Please take them and hand them around at your Clubs, Displays and events. The promotion of the Swap is a Federation task for all members clubs to assist with. The Bendigo Club members are to select a new Swap Committee on the 5 th February. I will provide an update. The meeting was held and they had trouble getting Office bearers from the Bendigo Club for Federation Committee. The Federation may have to take up running the Swap meet. Food sales were down on the Saturday and bottled water ran out.

AHMF UPDATE: The AHMF met online on the 17th January. To help raise some funds for Robert Shannon Trust we are considering a raffle each Delegates meeting. The proceeds will be paid to the Trust and used to support financial help to worthy applicants.

Operating Heritage Australia are doing great research into the use of Fossil Fuels in the future. There are over a million cars 25 years or over registered in Australia. They have aligned with Canberra Uni to study the total value of the movement including fuel and lubricants. Fuel companies are also interested in this. May be looking for some assistance with payment of specialists' fees. Heavy vehicles over 4.5 tons CVM are subject to National rules even if they are not being used to transport goods.
