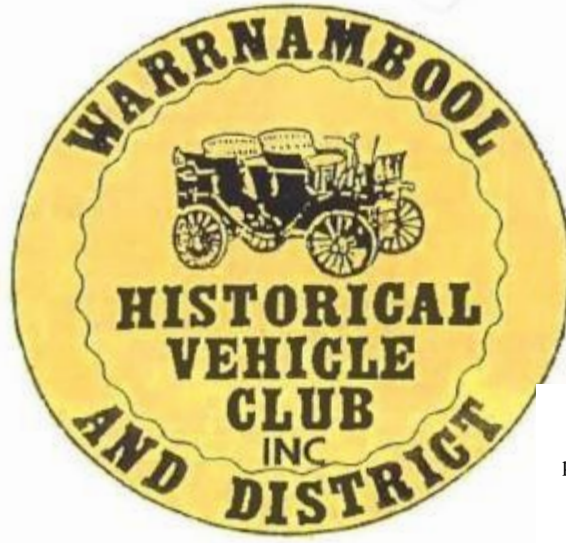

## **FEDERATION MEETING - Kerang 18<sup>th</sup> May 2024**

#### **2024 Events:**

**Mortlake Picnic:** This event was an excellent display with 110 vehicles on display. Thank you to those who came along and to those who made the day happen. Moyne Shire Mayor attended and shire help was excellent.

**Wunghnu Vehicle, Machinery and Collectables Display:** Another excellent display at the clubs own rally grounds. 70 tractors, 40 stationary engines and 42 cars on display. Thank you to all who made it a great display at Easter time.

**Scoresby Picnic:** This year's will be on the 5th May. 160-170 cars attended. \$560 raised for Peter Mac.Hospital.

**Murrabit Picnic 19th May** – First time for this event and it will be a terrific display with lots of interesting local and visitor vehicles on display. This is the day after the Delegates meeting in Kerang and a chance to make a full weekend of historic motoring. There is a lot of interest in this new picnic day. Please see flyer enclosed.

**Marong Picnic Sunday 25th August** – Usual picnic activities at this event. Please see flyer enclosed. St Johns has been booked. Harness racing club are keen to assist. CFA Marong will assist with carting water. We have not heard from the football club as yet. Shannon's will be represented. Have your club magazine with you with this event listed in the club calendar to gain free entry. Rotary will be on hand for a late breakfast or lunch or both.

**Baw Baw Picnic Sunday 20th October** – This is the date for the 2024 event. The Delegates meeting will be held the day prior to this event making it another great historic motoring weekend.

**Peter Mac Hospital Fundraiser:** I am looking forward to hearing from all Clubs how their fundraising efforts are going for this year. In Bendigo we held our two Clubs combined display day on the 7th April at the Bendigo Show grounds arena. May be it was a week after Easter, may be a number of other events on this time a year or maybe the school holidays but the Market was quiet and much smaller. After a lot of work by a number of members we raised \$902.05 for Peter Mac. The display itself was excellent.

**GOLDEN OLDIES TOUR 2024:** Just a reminder this Tour will be in and around the Daylesford, Maryborough and Ballarat areas. Anyone who can assist Anne with arranging and running of this event and with places in this area to go and see please make contact with Anne. I understand John Davis is helping Anne as well. The tour will leave the Marong Picnic as mentioned above. RACV will be the major sponsors once more. Anne has 50 entries so far but still room for a few more.

**BENDIGO SWAP:** All sites were booked out from the 2019 bookings by site holders at that swap and before COVID took over early in 2020. Regretfully there were around 80 sites not used in 2023. Those Site Holders who did not use their sites have been asked why and if there is no reply or a good excuse then the sites will go to the next ones on the waiting list.

We are looking at holding a display of Chryslers and MG's using local vehicles as both reach the 100 years milestones in 2024. That will be in the BEC. Then on vacant sites in the REC some more Survivor cars will be on display.

Our Volunteers Co-ordinator Ted will be asking this month for all Federation Clubs to send in a list of volunteers for 2024 Swap. Your Clubs reply will need to happen within the next 2 months please. Clubs will receive payment for volunteers.

Advertising and looking at some different ways to advertise the Swap but closer to the time. In the meantime we have flyers for Delegates to take back to their clubs. Thank you to the clubs that are advertising the event in the magazines. Please do run a copy of this flyer in your magazine or www site if you have not been advertising it already. The Swap

is owned by Federation and it's our main source of funding so it's important that all member clubs promote the swap in your local areas please. The Swap will be advertised in "Just Cars" and "Just Bikes" and on Win TV for \$7500.

The Bendigo Club members selected a new Swap Committee on the 5th February. Two main positions remain unfilled and that is Chair and Vice Chair which is disappointing when we have 175 club members and VVCC Bendigo receive 50% of the profits.

We are still negotiating for new Caterers to run that side of the event for the next 3 years.

The Agreement for the Management of the Swap is currently between the Federation and VVCC Bendigo. That expires at the conclusion of all the work and accounts for the 2026 Swap. VVCC Bendigo then has a further 5 years option to continue Management. There is a meeting at the Bendigo Club on the 29th May regarding this matter. If at any time Bendigo Club decides not to [www.federation.asn.au](http://www.federation.asn.au) Page 14 of 18 continue then Federation will be calling for expressions of interest from other member clubs and there will be sufficient hand over and training time.

**AHMF UPDATE:** The AHMF met on line on the 20th March. WA was represented and it is good they are involved again. AHMF donated \$2,000 to the Robert Shannon Trust. Any applications for younger members to receive some assistance from the Robert Shannon trust need to be with Federation by the end of May. The latest edition of Spoke N Hub was forwarded at the end of April to all Delegates. Any articles from Federation clubs would be most welcome. The AHMF AGM will be held in Adelaide this year. Items required for the Agenda soon please. OHA say there is over 1 million vehicles nationally on the Historic Registration scheme and over 2 million Australians involved in the movement. AHMF is watching the requirement of the proposed Misinformation Bill from Federal Government. Federal Government is considering lifting tariffs on historic vehicle parts that come to Australia from Overseas.

**FEDERATION – AOMC JOINT MEETINGS:** Next meeting will be 8th May. Next meeting with Vic Roads will be towards the end of May. If Clubs have matters that need discussing by both Committee will they please raise them at this meeting so as they can be included on the Agenda for the joint working party. We are discussing a large joint Historic Vehicle display in Melbourne on National Motoring Day 2025. They are having a meeting on 30<sup>th</sup> May with Vicroads.

Vic Roads have advised as follows to previous questions asked:

1. Registration number rights and 5 or 6-digit number plates issued prior to 1984: 5 and 6-digit number plates issued prior to 1984 were issued as general issue number plates. This means that a person has no Registration Number Rights to the number combination. As a general issue number plate, a person can move the plate to another registered vehicle in their name, on payment of the plate assignment fee. Payment of the plate assignment fee does not provide RNRs. A general issue number plate cannot be sold and can only be reassigned to a vehicle in the name of the same registered operator. If there is a record in VicRoads systems that a person has purchased the RNR, then that person holds the RNRs and the number plates/combination can be sold/transferred to another person. [www.federation.asn.au](http://www.federation.asn.au) Page 15 of 18 To confirm whether a person holds the RNR for a plate combination, an enquiry can be forwarded to [customplates@vicroads.com.au](mailto:customplates@vicroads.com.au)

2. Club permit renewals: No delays to club permit renewals are anticipated for those with an expiry date from 1 July 2024 onwards.

3. Club permit conditions A club permit is issued subject to general conditions. These can be found in the Club Permit logbook, or on the reverse side of the Club Permit Application form. These are supported by regulation 185 of the Road Safety (Vehicles) Regulations 2021.

From October 2021, in addition to general conditions, the Joint Venture Operator and DTP may issue 'operating conditions' on a club permit. These specify the permissible use of a club permit vehicle. For example, "Can only be used between sunset and sunrise".

When 'operating conditions' apply, the customer will be issued a Certificate of Approved Operations and this must be carried in the vehicle at all times. Regulation 187 of the Road Safety (Vehicles) Regulations 2021 refers.

4. Electric conversion of club permit vehicles: Persons converting vehicles to electric must comply with VSB14 code (LV). The vehicle must be inspected and certified by a VASS signatory and on issue of a VASS Approval Certificate, will be eligible for registration or CPS as applicable.

5. Club permit vehicle misuse: Information can be forwarded to: [registration.services@vicroads.com.au](mailto:registration.services@vicroads.com.au) Information should include the club permit number, vehicle details, photograph, and the club permit misuse.
